This data snapshot is provided to identify trends and highlight the work of community partnerships committed to making homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring in the state of Florida.



On one night in January 2023,

30,809

estimated people were experiencing homelessness.

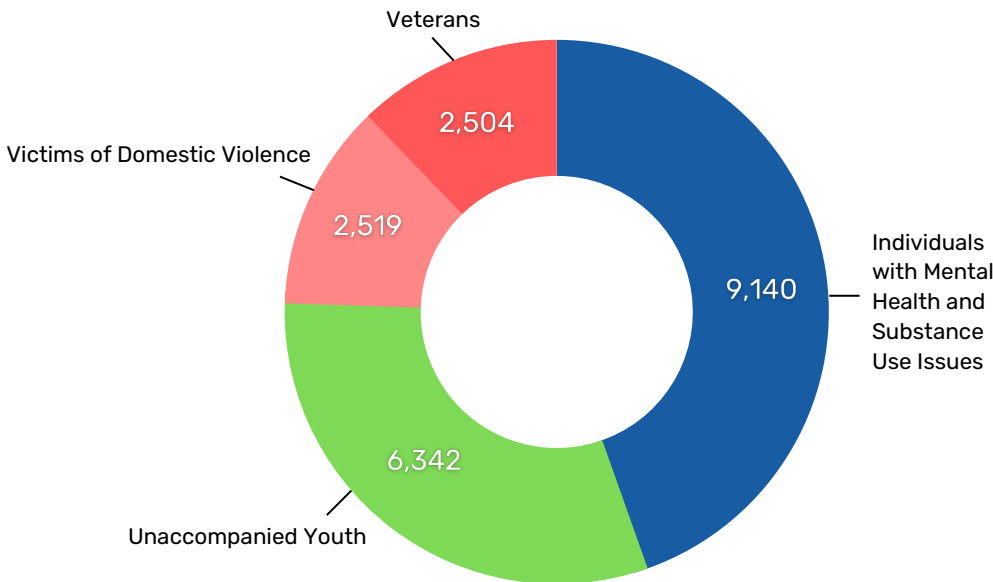

Florida saw a **35%** in **homelessness** among individuals with **mental illness and substance use disorders** from **6,755 to 9,140** individuals. Of the **30,809** homeless individuals found in the 2023 Point in Time Count, **5,374** were living with a **mental illness**, and **3,766** with a **substance use disorder**.
